China: Anhui

Watchman Nee aka Ni Tuoseng (aged 68, widower of Charity Chang, arrested on April 10, 1952 in Shanghai on charges of bribery, tax evasion, and theft of state property and government economic information but in reality for refusing to join the official Three Self Help church; convicted on all charges on June 21, 1956, sentenced to 15 years imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: died in prison of natural causes, had never been released despite completing his sentence, left a note under his pillow before he died stating "Christ is the Son of God who died for the redemption of sinners and resurrected after three days. This is the greatest truth in the universe. I die because of my belief in Christ. Watchman Nee")
