Rocco Buttiglione (aged 56, professor of political science, Minister of European Affairs in the Italian government, nominee for the European Commission, the European Parliament refused to endorse his nomination in a 27-36 committee vote on October 11, 2004 due to his support of traditional Christian morality and despite his assurances that he would not discriminate against others who rejected that morality; **UPDATE**: nomination was withdrawn by the Italian government after no compromise could be reached, later said "The new soft totalitarianism that is advancing on the left wants to have a state religion. It is an atheist, nihilistic religion - but it is a religion that is obligatory for all")
