Pastor Ibrahim Magunyi (described coordinated small arms and grenade attacks on two churches that left 17 dead and 'many' injured)

Bishop Paul Darmanin (described Sunday's attack: "around 10:30 am, local time, two hand grenades were thrown at the church of Our Lady of Consolation, only one exploded just in front of the building, not inside, causing some slight injuries. At the African Inland Church the attack was terrible. The assailants, after killing two soldiers who stood guard at the place of worship, threw some hand grenades into the building where the faithful gathered for church service. The aim was to make them escape outside, where they were

hit with the AK-47s taken from the soldiers. It was a well organized attack in which at least 16 people died and several were seriously wounded." - the toll is now 17 dead, including 3 children, and over 75 wounded)

Fr Giuseppe Zhao Hongchun ("invited" to a meal with the government's religious affairs department, he then called his parish assistant priest to say that "the talk would take several days" - his whereabouts are now unknown - he had previously asked his parishioners to pray for Fr Yue Fusheng, who is scheduled for episcopal ordination on July 6, 2012 in the Open church without Vatican approval)

Pakistan: Islamabad

Fr Rehmat Hakim Michael (has been accused of leading a "gang" which in 2001 kidnapped and killed Afghan refugees after they refused to convert to Christianity - the most likely reason for the filing of the police report is Fr Rehmat's efforts to obtain the return of two church properties that have been occupied by a powerful family since 1999)

Pakistan: Bahawalpur, Punjab state

Bishop Andrew Francis (UPDATE: condemned the lynching of a mentally ill young Muslim accused of Quran desecration, who was dragged from a police station by a mob summoned by mosque loudspeakers and set afire: ""We condemn the unspeakable and macabre gesture, like all forms of brutal violence. I am ashamed to think that it happened in my diocese. As a local Church let us continue to pay close attention and follow the story and its implications, with prudence and with prayer")

Bishop Rufin Anthony (UPDATE: stated "We strongly condemn the attack on the police station and the loss of a human life. The law enforcing agencies must act and ensure the rule of law. Taking the law into their hands is against the law. It is time for some changes in the legislation that will protect innocent lives and ensure the safety of the people accused and under trial. How much more blood do we have to endure for the authorities to realize that it is time to act. We don't want incidents like Shanti Nagar, Kasoor, Sialkot, and Gojra to be repeated. We urge them to take this as an eye opener and rescue the suffering.")

Father Zafar Samuel (commented on the lynching of a mentally ill young Muslim accused of Quran desecration: "This is a sad incident, we condemn it. This is an inhuman act. It must be condemned. The Punjab province has been in the limelight for the abuse of the blasphemy law. There is a strong need to spread awareness regarding blasphemy and laws associated with it. These naive people have no idea what it is all about.")

Mohamed Ibaouene (aged 36, convicted in absentia in Tigzirt court of pressuring a Muslim in Tindouf to change his religion on July 4 2012 - though his accuser was not present, sentenced to one year in prison and fined 50,000 dinars, not notified of his conviction)

Paul Aminu (football manager, stated: "I did not dare go to church last Sunday. I was too afraid of another attack. But as I drove to the gas station, I passed near a church. The youths of this church had mounted road blocks all around it, and were checking every vehicle very thoroughly, irrespective of who the driver was. Now, Christians and police are working side by side to guard the churches. Seeing this makes me feel safe enough to go back to mass this coming Sunday...They [Boko Haram] used to say they were fighting against the government, but lately they seem to want an Islamization of the entire country, and to do this they're trying to discourage us from going to worship. I think Christians have been really pushed against a wall with all these attacks...)

Pastor Youcef Nadarkhani (in prison under a death sentence for apostasy, has rejected an offer to be released from prison if he publicly acknowledges Islam's prophet Mohammed; **UPDATE**: is now scheduled for a new trial on September 6, 2012 on security charges, has written in his most recent letter: "I need to remind my beloveds, though my trial due has been so long, and as in the flesh I wish these days to end, yet I have surrendered myself to God's will.")

Michael Salman (given a <u>three year</u> suspended sentence - with 60 days to be served in jail and a \$12,180 fine - for 67 zoning violations related to a church he constructed and operated on his residential property)
