Viola Samir (aged 7, described how eight Christians in her class were prevented from attending Christian instruction by their teacher, one was beaten for not learning the Quran by heart, father later said "When my daughter told the teacher that the extra texts were not part of the Arabic curriculum, she was severely punished by her teacher. The Christian religious studies teacher complained to the headmaster, but he took no disciplinary action against the Muslim teacher. In the end, the teacher allowed the Christian children to leave the class to join their Christian studies class")

Egypt: Samalout, Minya province

Abanob Milad (aged 11, father said "Once, the teacher, Mohamed, caned Abanob on the back of his hands, afterwards forcing him to stand with his face to the board and both arms up in the air for the entire length of the lesson. My son had failed to repeat the Quranic text by heart when prompted")

Egypt: Delga village, near the city of Dayr Mawas, Minya province

Kyrellos Shafiq (aged 9, reported to have been given a zero for his homework, father said "The teacher made the other students pin down my son as he gave him the bastinado, caning him on his bare feet. It seems only Christians are given this punishment. They're 12 out of 42 in my son's class")

Egypt: Abu-Teig, Assiut province

Maccar Aziz (aged 10, told by a Muslim friend that the teacher had told the Muslim students to ostracize the Christian students on religious grounds)

Yet, with their meager earnings, they sacrificially provided for the church construction, including offering their own free labor to build the church. Today, all of our years of work and labor were brought down to the dust. We are not sure if we can build it again")

Mrs Shamala (said "There were around 10 of us inside the church having a prayer meeting. Our fellow believers pulled us out, but then we were manhandled by the male policemen when we refused to get out of the way of the bulldozer")

Mrs Dayamani (aged 40, right ankle fractured by police during the church demolition)

Sunitha (aged 28, fainted during the church demolition, hospitalized)

Kristina (aged 28, wife, mother of an 18 month old daughter, Syrian refugee, told of stories reported from her friends in Aleppo "But you know what's surprising? The church is still full, displaced people take their place. Especially Muslims are coming to the church now...That absolutely did not happen before the war. Still the Muslims are afraid — especially when entering and leaving the building — but they are there. The children have opened the church's doors, then the women followed, and finally the men...Many Muslims were genuinely surprised when they met Christian women in our churches willing to serve them. Their image was that all Christian women spend most of their days dancing in night clubs and drinking alcohol! Meeting each other was a shock, both for them and for us...For the first time in history, Muslims are coming to us. The only thing we have to do is tell them the good news, they are waiting for it. They realize that, when living in a Christian environment, the [Gospel] will be shared. They may even see it as a sign of weakness if it isn't...Many are re-thinking the faith they grew up in and have dropped their hostility towards Christians")

United Kingdom: Branford

Nissar Hussain (convert from Islam, husband of Kubra, as of October 2, 2015 has fled his home after more attacks and police inaction; attacked by two masked men when he left his home on November 17, 2015, beaten with the shaft of a pickaxe, suffered fractures in his left kneecap and left hand, underwent surgery to insert pins in the fractured bones; **UPDATE**: warned by police of an imminent threat to his life, moved to a safe house,

allowed to return to his home with a large police escort to remove personal items, said "My family and I have suffered greatly we have been under the cosh for so many years and the persecution has now reached epic levels. We simply have found the threat to our lives an untenable situation and in recent months in discussion with the British Pakistani Christian Association we have decided to move to a place of safety. Despite the hatred we have received we hold no animosity towards Muslims quite conversely we continue to have Muslim friends and pray for those who persecute us hoping one day they will recognize the commonality we share through our humanity")

Bangladesh: Gaibandha district

Police along with local Muslims attempted to arrest 300 Christian tribal people as part of a land dispute, three were killed and dozens injured, many fled, some fought back with bows and arrows, homes were looted

Nirmal Rozario (general secretary of the Bangladesh Christian Association: **UPDATE**: said "We saw police attack minority Christians. Since they are tribal, police thought they were weak and struck them hard. We condemn this indecent act and demand an investigation")

Fr Samson Marandy (brother of murder victim Ovidio Marandy; **UPDATE**: said that the people who had their homes looted now have no food, added "After 1962, the government bought 774,000 hectares of land that belonged to the Santal, where they grow sugar cane. The agreement provided that the land would be used only for this type of crop. If another crop was introduced, the land would go back to the original owners. In 2003, the local government suspended sugarcane production and so local Tribals asked for their land...These people have been living in absolute fear since the attacks; they don't have food, can't get medical treatment and don't have an income. We have been in touch with Caritas and the nuns for support. Some of them have also taken shelter in church buildings. But we can't do anything openly because the issue is so political")

Bishop Sebastian Tudu (**UPDATE**: said "I am very concerned by the incident, some people are also missing...Our people live in fear and cannot leave their homes for security reasons...I think that the attack was carried out because the victims are a minority and Christian. I call on the government to ensure the security of our people")

Emmanuel Baskey (father of three, said "We can't walk out of the village to find work. We have no food and no money, so we have been starving since the eviction on Sunday night. We are trying to survive on a few kilograms of rice, oil, lentils and few scraps of clothing. Besides burning my house, the attackers have looted my cows, goats, power tiller and water irrigation pump. I don't know how to recover from the great loss", added that 30 men are missing "We don't know what happened to them. Maybe they were killed or forcibly disappeared. We are ready to die but we won't give up our movement to claim our ancestral land")

Every day we suffer assaults and bombings, every day people are wounded and die. I am happy to taste the bitterness of the cross, in communion with Christ and with so many innocent people who suffer. We have the certainty that death is not the last word, but that the end is Resurrection")

Svria: Aleppo

Pastor Alim (alias, said "The situation in Aleppo has been unstable for a long time now. Ceasefires only last for a short time. As soon as the people catch breath, the fighting starts again...Many women and children from the other part have come to our area. Our church is able to help a total of 2,000 families, I think half of them are Muslims...We help some of them pay their rent and offer towards their medical needs. Our church has dug a well to provide clean drinking water...The other day, as we finished our meeting on

Friday, a bomb exploded next to the church, killing a young girl and her brother. On Sunday, when we were getting ready for church, bombs exploded around our house. I couldn't send my children to school. We had high expectations of a ceasefire, but they didn't last. People get really depressed, they feel there is no hope...We used to live on the fourth floor, very close to the frontline, the so-called 'red line'. We moved further away to my parents' house. Shortly after, a rocket hit very close to our apartment. One of our relatives died, shrapnel hit our house and broke through the walls...Every day we hear of someone who has died, every day we are surrounded by death. We feel the pain, but for those who died we cannot do anything. We can make a difference for the living, we can help them")

Andrea Minichiello Williams (Chief Executive of Christian Concerns; **UPDATE**: defended an unnamed Christian couple who have been denied to opportunity to adopt their foster children due to their traditional Christian beliefs, wrote "This couple's viewpoint is lawful and mainstream. The expression of a view that a child needs a mother and a father cannot justify a refusal to even consider a married couple's application to adopt. The separation of this couple from the children at this time is unthinkable....We warned Parliament that the so-called equality developments would damage freedom for Christians to live and speak out their faith – and engage fully with social needs in the nation. This is another in a long line of examples of the results of this ill-thought-through legislation, resulting in the potential heart-breaking separation of young children from the foster parents in whose care they are thriving, and where they feel love and security")

Natanael 'Wahed' Tumangger (convicted of killing a Muslim in the 2015 clashes despite the only evidence being the color of his clothes and having been denied legal representation, appeal underway, repeatedly beaten in prison, said "There's nothing to worry about me here. But what about my wife and our four children? How are they going to survive in my absence?")

Indonesia: Pertabas village, Aceh province

Berutu (said of attempts to rebuild the demolished churches, including her own "The government is afraid of pressures from Muslim clerics and extremists. When they gave instructions to knock down our church, they were no longer our protectors", added that Christians were under pressure to support Muslims in the election who had persecuted them "Vote wisely for your leaders – our fate for the next five years depends on it")

Archbishop Yustinus Harjosusanto (said "Following the bomb attack, all parishes in Samarinda were guarded by security forces during their Sunday afternoon Mass celebrations")

Mary Charles (refugee, said "We had to flee Boko Haram because they didn't allow us to go to our farm. We had no drinking water and we didn't have anything to eat. But I take courage from the Bible. Fr Valeriano Vaz (said that state tax collectors have begun to investigate clergy who have exchanged money to help parishioners "For you and me this may be a Good Samaritan act but officials may raise queries")

India: Calangute, Goa state

Fr Cipriano D'Silva (said "A small time hotelier came to us and requested change to pay his staff. We obliged him. We help those in need in whatever way possible...On average, we get 70,000 rupees on Sunday but after the withdrawal we collected only 48,000 [US\$700]")

India: Bhopal

Fr Thomas Panackal (said that his parish had collected 1,500 rupees a week [US\$22] but that had been reduced by a third)

India: Delhi

Fr Savarimuthu Shankar (**UPDATE**: ssaid of his diocese "So far no parish has reported any remarkable difference")

India: Sagar, Madhya Pradesh state

Bishop Anthony Chirayath (**UPDATE**: said "scrapping high denomination notes in the country does not have any serious impact on the running of the diocese and its institutions. Our diocese is in a rural area and people lead very ordinary lives with little money. Our Sunday collection was not affected as nobody would ever offer the scrapped high denomination notes")

India: Jhabua, Madhya Pradesh state

Fr Rocky Shah (said that the Sunday following the demonetization was Mission Sunday "People offered high denomination notes which they normally do not do")

India: Jammu and Kashmir state

Fr Shaiju Chacko (said "Our collections are a bare minimum and we hardly get any high value currency. Therefore, the move has not affected the church here at all")

So we decided to intensify prayers for peace during Advent...A secondary school has just been evacuated in the western sector and last night a missile hit another school. Fortunately, the building was empty and there were no casualties...the movement of people on the streets is minimal. Uncertainty and suffering prevail...Every first Sunday of the month, starting on 4 December, we shall conduct a procession with songs and prayers for peace [as will] every Franciscan home and parish in the world...We continue to pray for peace and also for those who drop bombs on our houses, and churches")
